**CITY BOARD, COMMISSION, AND COMMITTEE
DESCRIPTIONS AND MEETING SCHEDULE**

Mayor Appointed:

<p>Brownfield Redevelopment Authority - 3-Year Term (no more than 9 members) Prepares, amends, adopts, and submits to the Rochester City Council for approval a new set of bylaws and rules of procedure as it pertains to brownfield projects. Meets as needed.</p>
<p>Cemetery Advisory Committee - 1-Year Term (no more than 5 members) Aids and assists the City Council, which is the cemetery board Meets as needed.</p>
<p>City Beautiful Commission - 3-Year Term (no more than 9 members) Conceives, formulates, promulgates, and develops plans for the beautification of Rochester. Meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 7PM at Rochester City Hall.</p>
<p>Compensation Commission - 5-Year Term (5 members) Determines the salaries of all elected officials. Meets as needed.</p>
<p>Construction Board of Appeals - 5-Year Term (5 members) Exercises powers pursuant to section 14 of Public Act No. 230 of 1972. Hears appeals and renders a decision for rejected building permits. Meets as needed.</p>
<p>Downtown Development Authority (DDA) - 4-Year Term (11 members) Enhances quality of life for the City through revitalization of the downtown district, with respect to the natural environment and historical character of the downtown. Meets on the third Wednesday of each month at 7PM.</p>
<p>Historical Commission - 3-Year Term (no more than 15 members) Protects and serves Rochester's historic and prehistoric resources for the use, education, enjoyment, and economic benefit of present and future generations. Meets on the fourth Thursday of each month at 7PM.</p>
<p>Parking Management Advisory Board - Staggered Terms (5 voting members, 4 non-voting) Aids and assists City and City Council regarding parking matters. Meets as needed.</p>
<p>Planning Commission - 3-Year Term (9 members) The powers and duties of the Commission are provided by Act Number 285 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan for the year 1931. Meets on the first Monday of each month at 7PM at Rochester Council Chambers.</p>
<p>Principal Shopping District Board (PSD) - 4-Year Term (7 members) Oversees the promotional and marketing activities in Downtown Rochester, especially retail and special events, campaigns, and partnerships. Meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 7PM at Rochester City Hall.</p>
<p>Retirement Board - 3-Year Term (7 voting members, 1 non-voting) Administers and manages the OPEB Benefits. Meets every 3 months.</p>

Council Appointed:

Board of Ethics - 3-Year Term (3 members)

Hears prospective claims of alleged violations of the city's ethics ordinance. Meets as needed.

Board of Review - 3-Year Term (3 members)

Finance and Treasury Department coordinates with the City Assessor for the three annual Boards of Review, in March, July, and December.

Community Media Network - 3-Year Term (1 appointee)

Supports Public Access and residents, organizations, schools, and agencies of the consortium, with free or low-cost access to television producing, training, and cablecast. Attends meetings as needed.

Dinosaur Hill Nature Preserve Liaison - 3-Year Term (1 liaison)

Represents and communicates public interest regarding Dinosaur Hill Nature Preserve. Attends meetings as needed.

Bicentennial Committee - 4-Year Term (8 members)

Plans and coordinates for 2017 bicentennial celebration. Meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 4PM at Rochester City Hall.

Historic District Study Committee - 3-Year Term (at least 1 member)

Conducts research, photographs, and determines historic and non-historic resources within each proposed historic district. Meets on the first Wednesday of each month at 7PM at the Rochester Fire Department.

Historic District Commission - 3-Year Term (7 members)

Fosters historic preservation activities, projects, and programs within the City.
Meeting times are to be determined.

ICCA Cable TV - Continuous Terms (1 appointee)

The Intergovernmental Cable Communications authority is an 11-city consortium with Comcast and Wow-way, it is also a resource for citizens who are pursuing resolution of issues with a cable company. Meets as needed.

Library Board Liaison - 3-Year Term (1 liaison)

Rochester Hills Public Library is located in Rochester; the RHPL is funded through a millage by Rochester, Oakland Township and Rochester Hills.

Older Persons' Commission Citizen At Large - 1-Year Term (1 appointee)

Adopts and monitors policies under the provisions of the Interlocal Agreement, which establishes the basic purpose, organization, structure, and operation of OPC. Meets on the first Thursday of each month.

Paint Creek Trailways Commission - 3-Year Term (2 commissioners from each member unit)

Responsible for the ownership and maintenance of the Paint Creek Trail. Meets on the third Tuesday of each month at 7PM at Rochester Council Chambers.

RARA Board - 3-Year Term (8 members)

Provides recreation programs for all ages, in a variety of areas, such as sports classes, fitness, skiing, special events, and more. Meets as needed.

Zoning Board of Appeals - 3-Year Term (7 members; 2 alternates)

Exercises powers provided by Act 207 of 1921, as amended, and the Rochester Zoning Ordinance. Meets on the fourth Wednesday of each month at 7PM at Rochester Council Chambers.
